



Youth Soccer League Rules (Age 3 – 2nd Grade)

I. LEAGUE RULES

- a. All games will be played at Lakeside Sports Complex (2000 W 400 S, Orem UT).
- b. Games will consist of a 15-20 minute practice, followed by a game.
 - i. Four 8-minute quarters (running clock)
 - ii. Games are officiated by volunteer coaches. Please take the opportunity to stop and teach when necessary.
- c. Lineups
 - i. Age 3 to K – 5v5 with no goalkeeper
 - ii. 1st/2nd Grade – 7v7 (6 in the field, 1 goalie)
- d. All players are required to play at least 2 quarters/1 half.
- e. Substitutions can be made at any time. Teams do not need to wait for a dead ball.
- f. Game scores and league standings are not kept. Focus is on development and fun.
 - i. Games can end in a tie.
- g. Points of Emphasis
 - i. Slide tackles are NOT allowed
 - ii. A handball will be called when a player intentionally reaches for or grabs the soccer ball. Unintentional hand balls should not be called unless it results in a clear advantage.
 - iii. Coaches should rotate players to try all positions.
 - iv. NO heading for any age group.

II. PLAYER ELIGIBILITY

- a. Players must play in the division for the age/grade they are currently enrolled in.
 - i. Each player may only play for one team.
- b. Only registered players may participate. If a team is short players, coaches may pull players from the opposing team to even sides.

III. EQUIPMENT

- a. Teams will be provided with game balls and uniforms.
- b. Shin guards are highly recommended but not required.
- c. Teams will use a size #3 ball.
- d. Players must wear athletic closed-toed shoes or rubber/plastic cleats (no metal).

IV. FIELD DIMENSIONS

- a. Age 3 to K – 25 x 40 yards
- b. 1st/2nd Grade – 35 x 50 yards

V. GAME RULES

a. Positions

- i. The four main positions are forward, midfielder, defender, and goalkeeper (1/2 grade only)
- ii. The goalkeeper is the only player allowed to use their hands and may only do so within the penalty area.
- iii. Play begins with a kickoff at the midline.
 1. The ball may be kicked in any direction on kickoffs (including backwards). Coaches should remind players of this.

b. Scoring

- i. A goal is scored when the entire ball passes over the goal line.
- ii. After a goal play is reset with a kickoff at midfield.

c. Direct Free Kick

- i. A free kick from which a goal may be scored against an opponent without a second player touching the ball.
- ii. Kicker must not play or touch the ball a second time until another player touches it.
- iii. Opponent must be at least 5 yards from the ball until it is kicked.
- iv. Direct Free Kick is awarded for fouls, including but not limited to...
 1. Tripping, or attempting to trip an opponent
 2. Spitting at, kicking, striking, attempting to kick/strike, or knocking over an opponent
 3. A player, other than a goalkeeper, deliberately handles the ball with their hands

d. Indirect Free Kick

- i. A free kick from which a goal may NOT be scored unless the ball is played or touched by another player of either team.
- ii. Indirect Free Kick is awarded for the following, including but not limited to...
 1. Kicker plays their own throw in, free kick, kickoff, goal kick, etc without another player touching the ball
 2. Illegal contact by Goalkeeper

e. Penalty Kick (1st/2nd grade only)

- i. Awarded when a foul, which ordinarily results in a direct free kick, occurs within the opponent's penalty area.
- ii. All players, except the kicker and opposing goalkeeper, shall be within the field of play but outside the penalty area and at least 5 yards from and behind the penalty mark until the ball is kicked.
- iii. For age 3 – K, fouls in the penalty area will be moved outside the penalty box and result in a direct free kick.

f. Corner Kick

- i. Awarded to the attacking team when the entire ball passes over the end line out of bounds, when last touched by the defending team.

g. Goal Kick

- i. Awarded to the defending team when the entire ball passes over the end line out of bounds, when last touched by the attacking team.
- ii. Players from the opposing team must be on their side of the field (at least midfield) until the ball is kicked.
- iii. No drop kicks.

h. Offside

- i. Offside will not be enforced for this age group.

- i. Throw-ins
 - i. Awarded to a team when the opponent was the last to touch/play a ball and it crosses the entire touchline.
 - ii. Players must have both feet on the ground and face the field of play when making their throw.
 - iii. Thrower shall use both hands and deliver the ball from over their head using both hands.
- j. Player Conduct
 - i. Players may be asked to sit out for behavior issues or excessive roughness. Any players fighting should sit out a minimum of a quarter depending on severity.

VI. WEATHER

- a. This program is held outdoors and will usually be held despite uncomfortable weather conditions. Games/practices will be held whether it is sunny, raining, windy, etc., with the following exceptions.
- b. Field Conditions
 - i. If the playing surface is determined to be unsafe, games/practice may be cancelled.
- c. Lightning
 - i. If there is lightning within 4 miles, play will be suspended immediately, and all players/spectators must go to their cars. Play can resume after 30 minutes of no lightning. If there is another strike, the clock resets.

VII. COACHES/PARENTS

- a. Coaches, parents, and spectators of any kind are expected to follow the Orem Parks & Recreation Code of Conduct (see attached). Coaches are responsible for ensuring all patrons associated with their team abide by the Code.
- b. There will be zero tolerance for arguing, yelling at, or ridiculing staff in any way. If there are any concerns with staff, please notify the League Coordinator.

Code of Conduct



The City of Orem Recreation Department has established a Code of Conduct which applies to all persons participating in any way in any Orem City Recreation Department programs or facilities. All participants, volunteers, coaches, patrons, and spectators are expected to know, promote, and adhere to the following standards of conduct.

1. Promote and encourage good sportsmanship by demonstrating positive support for players, coaches, officials, participants, and employees.
2. Treat everyone with respect, regardless of race, color, age, sex, religion, national origin, disability, or skill level. Putting down or demoralizing others is not acceptable.
3. Adhere strictly to the rules of the game/facility (including official's or employee's decisions) and do not attempt to change or manipulate those rules in order to win or for personal benefit.
4. No smoking, drinking, or being under the influence of alcohol or drugs will be allowed in the facilities or on playing fields.
5. Abuse or harassment of players, volunteers, coaches, officials, spectators, or employees in any form will not be tolerated. Bullying is a form of harassment which is also prohibited.
6. Foul, abusive, profane, or vulgar language is prohibited and will not be tolerated.
7. Fighting is prohibited. Fighting includes physical (hitting, pushing, touching, "getting in the face of") or verbal (threatening, making fun of, calling names, cursing, arguing).
8. Remember that youth programs are for the kids [to learn fundamentals, techniques, sportsmanship, teamwork, and have fun]; they are not for adults! Therefore, **all** kids deserve a right to fairness at all times.
9. Conduct yourself in a manner that would be an example and a role model to youth under your direction or in the vicinity.
10. Coaches agree to support and work with assigned team throughout the designated season, and agree to hold regular practices (at least once a week) and show up to scheduled games.
11. Any equipment issued does not become personal property and all equipment must be returned in good condition to the City at determined time.
12. Promote team work, physical conditioning and teaching skills appropriate to the sport. Do not teach, encourage, or allow rough or dirty tactics of play.

Anyone who does not comply with this policy, or who conducts himself or herself in any unbecoming manner, will be subject to disciplinary action including (but not limited to) verbal or written warning, being asked to vacate the premises, suspension, or expulsion from the program, class, facility, or field and associated privileges will be terminated without refund. Financial restitution may be required when appropriate. Criminal violations will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law.
